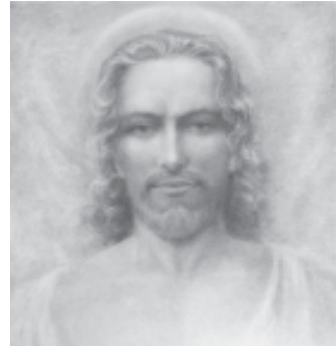

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*Dear Friends and Spiritual Family,*

Each year as August approaches we are reminded of the founding of Questhaven in 1940 and the coming of the Masters in 1950. August holds great significance for the Christward Ministry as we look at what the founders, Revs. Flower and Lawrence Newhouse, accomplished, sixty-five years ago in finding Questhaven and establishing this Work.

Since Flower's transition in 1994 and then the fire in 1996, Questhaven has been in an evolving cycle of change. The number of dedicated and active participants is growing, from those self-giving servers in the office, the singing choir, bell choir, dancers and movement choir, to those who prepare and serve a delightful spread of food each Sunday after church. Then there are those who plan projects, mow the hills, prune and weed the gardens, all serving with joy in the accomplishment of beautifying this holy place for retreatants to come and experience God.

We have meditation classes and study groups that have been rewarding for those who attend. In 2003 we began the Holy Quest series, which has been a transforming experience for many. The uniqueness of this opportunity—staying on the retreat grounds, eating and studying together as a group—brings in the power.

This year we began a small but growing group to revisit the original lessons of the Masters in Chapelito, where their pictures are hung. What an awakening and inspiring opportunity this is, in putting ourselves back in the environment of the days when these Masters came to Flower, and reading her comments as well as their deep wisdom teachings. The Great Ones emphasized the need to be responsible for living the truth that was given, and to keep centered in the Light and at peace. We have felt an acceleration of consciousness and energy since taking on this charge.

Teilhard de Chardin wrote: *Seeing. We might say that the whole of life lies in that verb. . . and that, doubtless, is why the history of the living world can be summarized as the elaboration of ever more perfect eyes within a cosmos in which there is always something more to be seen.*

This is what we are trying to do—see more widely into the messages that the Masters brought us. There is no limit to what can be learned and experienced when our eyes are opened to the possibilities of the inner worlds. We realize the Great Ones are closer to us and more aware of our needs than we know. It is up to us to open the door and climb in consciousness, just part way, to meet them. The Divine help is there always for us to tap into when we can rise above the self and our outer living in consciousness—this, then is our aspiration.

Flower has said: *Living the Life is infusing everything we think, do and act with spiritual consciousness.*

May this year continue to unfold in life's highest adventure for each of you as you remember your goals and commitments to the Living Christ.

# The World is Awakening to Reality of Perfected Men and Women

In times like these it may seem strange to concentrate upon a reality which *appears* remote from our external world. The sun lies a great distance from us. Yet, if it should cease sending the earth its radiations, a greater catastrophe would be upon us than the evils of a thousand wars. Frequently we realize that the factors which exert the strongest effects are not things we can taste or touch, but which, nevertheless, like sunlight and gravitation, govern our lives to a considerable degree. Imagine, for a moment, what our world would be like were goodness, love, and truth were suddenly to cease. No loss, or difficulty could equal the cessation of constructive qualities in the human kingdom. Without them existence would become a nightmare. Civilization is still crude, impetuous, and quarrelsome, but there are sufficient benevolent powers guiding men and events to exert a brake on disruptive and undisciplined energies. *Slowly but inevitably the Good is achieving more deliberate momentum.* Mankind may still harbor wars, while at the same time it senses the birth pangs of conscience and universal compassion.

We are devotees of perfection even though we still express imperfection. One strong example of goodness, integrity, and dedication does more to really uplift others than all the subtle persuasions of oratory or cunning bribery.

Abraham Lincoln was not a perfect man, but that he towered above other men was evident to all who came to know him. The secret of his helpfulness to his countrymen was revealed one day to his Secretary of War. At a time when everyone around him was restless and tense with anxiety and fretfulness, Lincoln stood calm and untroubled. Mr. Stanton could not help but wonder how his chief maintained such control and he therefore ventured to say, "Mr. Lincoln, you always seem to be calm and unworried. How do you manage it?" The president answered, "Well, Stanton, *when a man feels he is only a pipe for omnipotence to sound through, he doesn't worry much.*"

## Channels of Direction

Those who ponder upon the records of history notice that humanity has always been influenced, instructed or saved by individuals who were consciously or unknowingly channeled by supreme direction. Such persons were not always understood or appreciated, for ignorance is distrustful of wisdom. Some of these who stirred men into taking progressive steps were martyrs for their cause: Socrates, Hypatia, Jacques de Molay, Bruno, Savonarola, Galileo, Jakob Boehme and Roger Bacon. The force of evolution is most evident in the pages of history. With the advance of knowledge, multitudes have been gradually changed from savages to Truth-loving men. It is obvious that the summit of life is conscious channelship for God and inner completeness of being. Since the early dawn of human existence upon this globe, a few have attained the prize towards which all mankind labors—*perfection*. Those who have won their race in life are called our Advanced Brothers and Sisters, Adepts, Masters or Lords. Although the majority of us are pledged to one-pointed following of the Lord Christ, we realize without bias and prejudice that perfection has been gained by more than one individual. The race is opened to all and sooner or later we must enter a marathon in which we do not compete with others, but only with our own unmastered selves.

He Who is our Lord Jesus, the Christ, symbolizes Archetypal Man—the mastership of self every man must win. Our allegiance shall always be to Christ throughout all the eons of experience that confronts us—but we shall frankly and respectfully revere the Good found in an Advanced Brother or Sister who has clarified the Path of Growth for us.

## Their Tasks

When those who have conquered themselves pass into life beyond our dimension of perception, they choose one of several ways for the continuing of their unfoldments. Mastery is not the end of effort, but only the *beginning of conscious Divinity!* Some will choose to become Sentinels of the Supreme Spirit in the world of men. Others will choose to become Servers of the Logos, or they may instead decide to complete their unfoldment through the Deva line of evolution. Always will a few select the work of being the unseen counselors of mankind. The first and latter groups of the inner government affect our lives most directly. All of the perfected men and women endeavor to raise the consciousness of human beings according to the pattern given by the highest representative—the Christ.

## **Help Must Be Merited**

It is because we are still blinded by our imperfections that we do not realize the directive influence of our advanced wayshowers. When men through their selfishness or merits attract wars, the Masters do not extinguish them. ## **Unusual Happening**

Once in a long while we hear of incidents which recall to mind the ever-present watchfulness of the invisible government of the world. A friend of ours recounted an unusual happening which occurred during the last world war. In a hospital where he was recuperating from an injury of battle, he became friendly with one of the night nurses. Because she was a seeker of spiritual Truth, she shared a peculiar experience with the soldier whose interests were similar to her own. This is what she told him:

## **During a Heavy Battle**

During a very heavy battle so many men were hurt that the injured's needs were greater than was the supply of medication to meet such an overwhelming demand. The nurse who was telling her account was herself an anxious observer of that tragic emergency. She had charge, at nighttime, of a large ward. This particular night she and her assistants were beside themselves for want of dressings and drugs to relieve the distress of the wounded. Unable to control herself, this nurse went outside onto a large porch that faced the front of the hospital. She met one of the doctors there, pacing up and down with restless helplessness. Long trained to the mercy of prayer, the young woman sent out a silent invocation for God's immediate help for

the suffering. At the close of her prayer the doctor engaged her in a brief discussion of their mutual challenge. While they spoke, a strange officer approached them. He nodded to the two on the porch and went alone into the hospital. In a very short while he returned, glanced at the nurse and the doctor, and went on his way. The nurse returned to her war to find that a miracle had happened! Every moan was silenced. Every wound had stopped bleeding. A great peace had descended upon the entire hospital and had brought relief to the sufferers. The medical staff was amazed by this unparalleled event in their experience. The nurse told her listener that she sincerely believed that a Selfless Brother had heard the call for help and had come to speak the Word of Healing for the wounded.

Knowledge of Perfected Men and Women blesses and strengthens our entire incarnation. Although They are far beyond us in development, They are near in interest and compassion. The most definite impression they make upon us who believe in Them, or know Them, is to fill us with the desire to continue unfolding, that in time we too may selflessly reflect God's majesty and goodness as purely and as wisely.

# *Meet Gwen and James Hulbert*

Gwen and James Hulbert have faithfully served the Christward Ministry and Questhaven Retreat for over fifty years. They pay tribute to Flower and Lawrence Newhouse as powerful influences in their lives.



These two each met Flower while young. Residing in the state of Washington, James's family were neighbors of Esther Sullivan, who hosted Flower's retreats there. Esther's first husband, John Gardner, had shared Flower's angel teachings with James, who was so profoundly inspired by them that he aspired to create angel likenesses - which he eventually would do.

Gwen and her mother had met Flower and Lawrence at their lectures in Los Angeles. That contact strongly motivated them to relocate closer to Questhaven. Characteristically, Lawrence, the ever-welcoming host, helped Gwen's mother find land for their home.

Each of these devoted souls began life in families where there was strong spiritual influence with sparse material means. Gwen was born in Beaver Hill, Connecticut, whereas James was born in Beaver Creek, Oregon.

An enterprising woman, Gwen's mother had immigrated to the US from Germany in her early twenties. Starting a new life in Staten Island as a governess, she saved money to buy land in Connecticut. There she ran a retreat featuring lots of fresh air and health foods. Into this atmosphere, she birthed Gwen. Born at home, Gwen arrived during the famous 1938 Nor'Easter with unusual accompaniment -a violinist playing "Ave Maria," an astrologist working up her chart, and a third person doing her numerology.

James was likewise born at home, the youngest of four surviving children of eight. His father died when James was quite young. Fortunately one of James's uncles provided a positive

role model. He arranged for James and his sister, Elizabeth (Wood) to go to a private Lutheran school. This provided them with good basic Christian training and experience.

From the age of three, James was constantly drawing, a portent of his future calling. As a teenager he relocated from Washington to southern California. Along with Gordon Bleth, David Panman and John Sundsten, he lived for a time in the old stone house, the original building at Questhaven.

With leads and encouragement from Questhaven people, James ultimately found work at Convair. Shortly thereafter he was drafted into the Army and sent to Korea. During this stint, Esther Sullivan, Marian Clark, Dorothy Thomas, and many other members of the early Questhaven spiritual family wrote him letters and sent him cookies. Even while on duty, James continued his passion— drawing automobiles. His superior officer pointedly observed that James was a poor soldier but good at drawing cars. Also, while in Korea, James sent a portrait of a young woman to Flower. She responded that he was portraying the soul of Gwen Jackson, the one who would become his wife.

Gwen’s early life in Connecticut brought her unusual influences. Neighbors who were descendents of Miles Standish showed Gwen’s parents how to live off the land, harvesting wild plants and making furniture. Her family espoused the Zoroastrian-oriented Mazdaznan teachings, emphasizing man’s relationship to earth, proper diet and purity as well as good thought, good words and good deeds.

After each of these young people relocated to this area, Gwen and James met at Questhaven. During their first walk together, they *knew* that they would someday be married. What remained to settle was *when*. Three years later, the Hulbert wedding, in Chapelito, was the first one performed by Dr. Stephen Isaac.

James’s passion for drawing cars pushed him to prepare a portfolio for entrance to an excellent school of art and design in LA. Receiving a scholarship to the school, he was halfway through his courses when he and Gwen married.

The newlyweds moved to Detroit for almost four years. Here James worked for General Motors, where several of his auto designs were used during the 1960s. He became senior designer for Oldsmobile. Concurrently Gwen majored in science at Wayne State University, completing her bachelor’s degree there. After returning to California, James taught art and design at Palomar College for over 30 years. In 1979 he obtained his doctoral degree in psychology and art.

For many years, under Flower’s supervision, James drew portraits of members’ Guardians and other Angels, Flower, and several of the Masters. His work is displayed in some of the retreat buildings.

In the 1950s, James designed Questhaven's gate and its attached curving wall. Recently he integrated the wall with the brick garden enclosures along with a new Questhaven sign and plaque. In 1968-69, he designed Friendship House.

James found in Lawrence a model of great character and fearlessness, one who expected highest standards of workmanship of himself and others. When Lawrence passed in 1963, James designed the Lawrence Newhouse memorial and fountain to honor his ideal man. After Flower passed in 1994, he added to that design, incorporating a memorial to her. He planned and engaged the artists to complete the beautiful, expanded Newhouse Memorial Courtyard we know today.

James also organized the first volunteer rotating gate guards for Questhaven, recalling how conscientious they all were. Singing in the choir for 15 years and ushering on Sundays for 27 years were other offerings.

Besides singing every part from soprano to tenor, Gwen has long assisted the choir as music librarian, warming up the singers before the regular practice and directing them when needed. Science-trained, she was a medical technologist for over 30 years. Since retiring, she has planned and led spiritual journeys for Questhaven travelers. Destinations included the Bristlecone Pines, Alaska, Mt. Wheeler, Mt. Whitney and Mt. Frazier.

James and Gwen, under the leadership of Lawrence, formed several groups in the 1960s to alert citizens about the dangers of communism. In more recent years they have offered refreshingly original workshops and classes at Questhaven. In these they incorporate their multi-faceted skills in art, photography, wildflowers and science with spiritual subjects.

Beginning in their youth, Gwen and James have continued into their senior years as partners in service to God and our Lord Christ through this work begun by Flower and Lawrence Newhouse. We honor them and are most grateful for their many years of devoted discipleship.

# ***Blessing and Healing Through Light and Color***

The light, heat and color of the sun are vital to humankind! Without them no living thing could exist. Ancient people worshipped the sun, but in modern times we have lost much of this intimate relationship with the heavens and the light that sustains our lives.

In the last century, John Ott, developer of time-lapse photography, discovered that using natural light improved people’s health and well-being. Modifying fluorescent tubes to more closely replicate the full spectrum of natural sunlight and studying their effect, Dr. Ott found a reduction in stress and illness as well as improvement in plant growth, children’s school performance and factory workers’ productivity.

As primal light passes through the ethers to earth, it differentiates into colors of varying rates of vibration. Each color is a wave length of radiant energy and has a different frequency which can affect our mood, our energy and our well-being. The warm, stimulating colors—red, orange and yellow—help activate us as they energize, excite and vitalize. The cool, calming colors—blue, indigo and violet—are helpful in counteracting fever and inflammation and inspiring us in creativity and knowledge of our divinity. Green is the great neutralizer, the color of balance. It has more serenity than any other color. Just gaze at a meadow or a forest!

Color was used in healing 500 years before Christ by the Greek philosopher Pythagoras. In Dr. Edwin Babbitt’s 1877 classic book called *The Principles of Light and Color: The Healing Power of Color*, he explained that healing comes from nature and that color therapy helps bring the body’s vibrational rate back into balance. He suggested looking at small cloths of color to draw their healing vibrations into your body. Other healers suggest seeing or visualizing certain colors while breathing in their vibrations. Just as doctors dispense pills, so the color therapist hopes to bring the body back into balance through the vibrations of color.

Questhaven’s founder, the Reverend Flower A. Newhouse, stressed the influence of color on our lives and frequently described the magnificent colors she saw on the inner planes—colors far more glorious than those of our color spectrum. She says the Light of God is the sustainer of life and tells us to “contemplate the release of Light energies into and through all the faculties and systems of being.” In *The Christward Way* Flower writes about the Master Elision, who is able to give us knowledge concerning ourselves and our Divine Life Plan. “*This Master meditates upon light waves and sends Her instruction into the world through this medium.*”

By learning more about the use of light and color, by carefully choosing colors—in our foods, in the clothes we wear, in our environments, and in our healing visualizations, we can bring the blessing and healing of all the colors of the rainbow into our lives.
